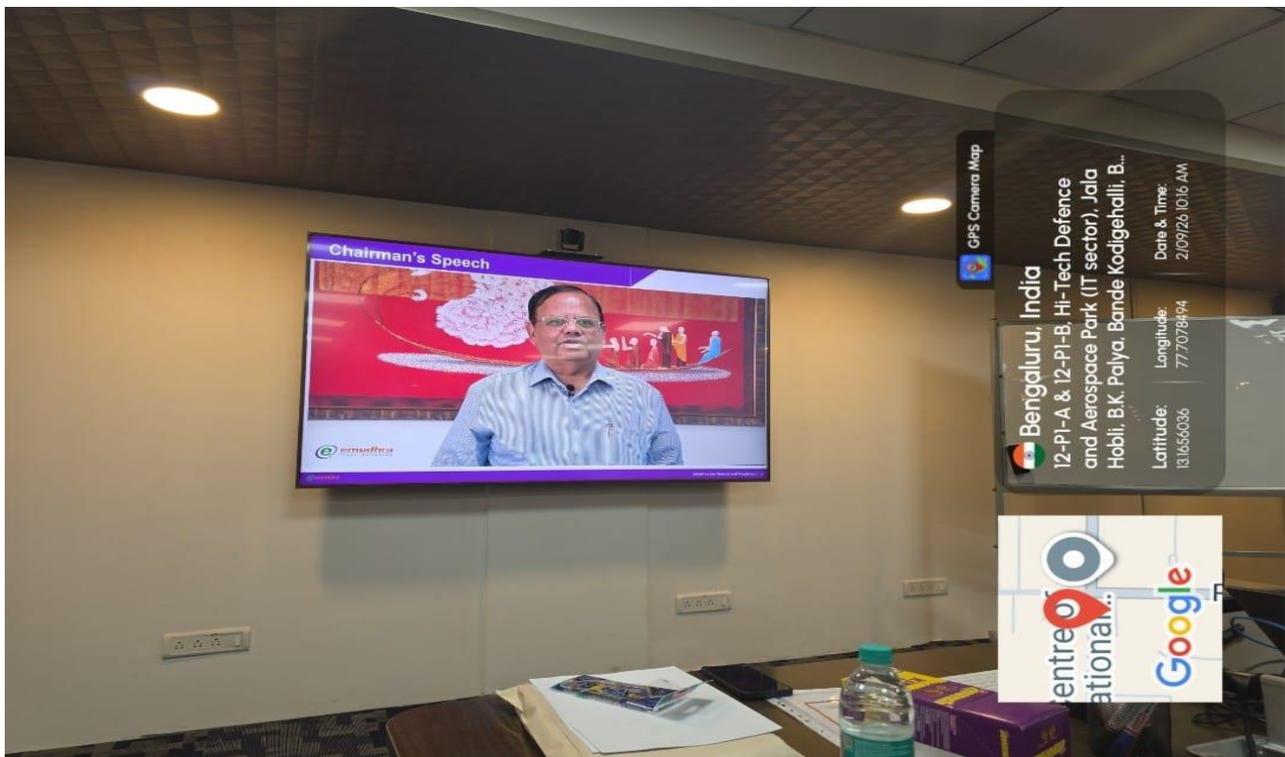

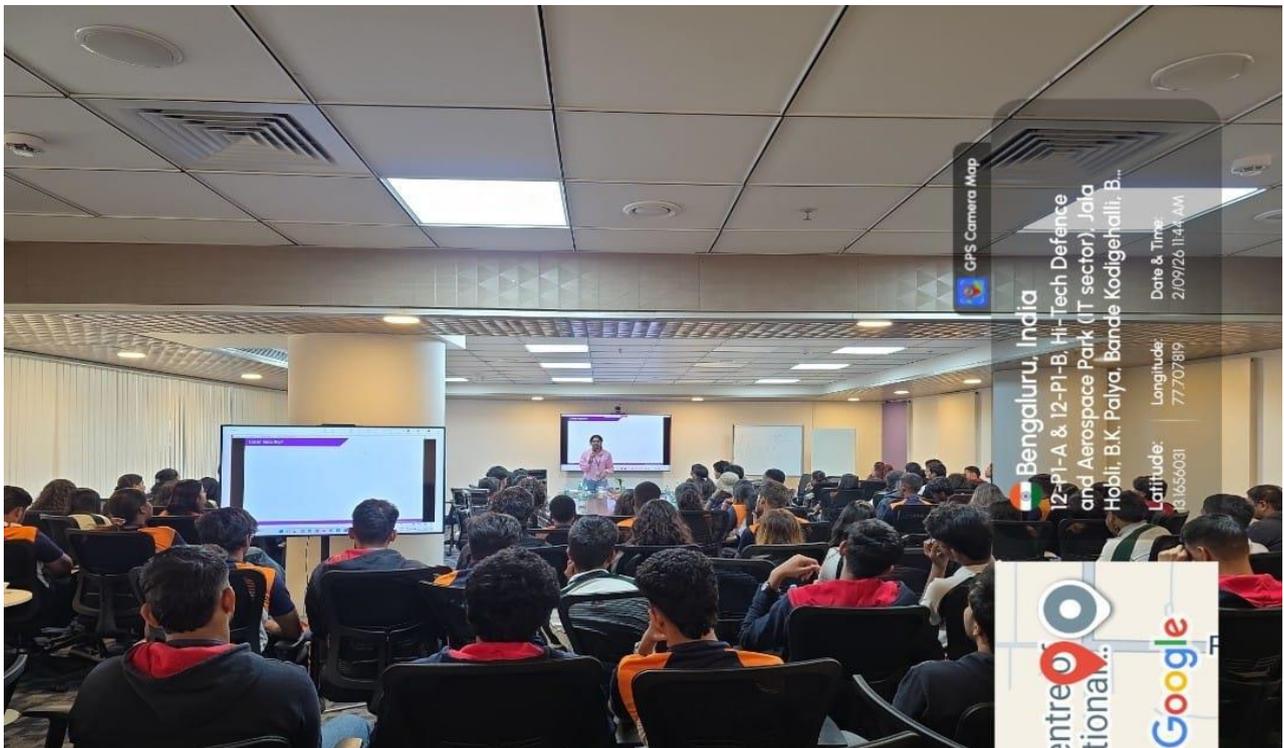

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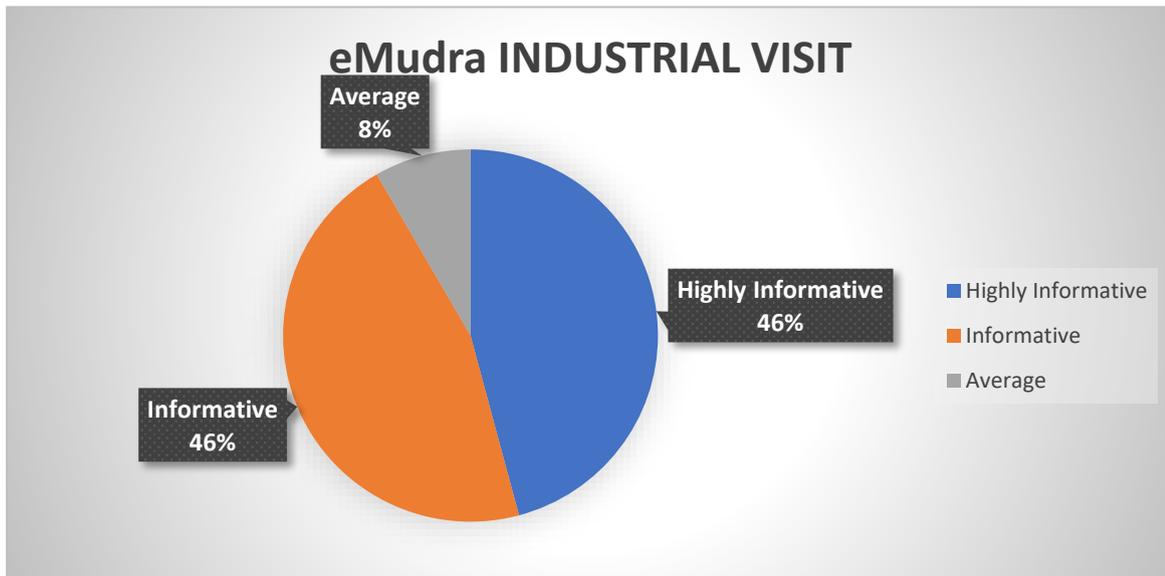
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experts, and observing various processes with keen interest. Their enthusiasm and discipline contributed significantly to the smooth and successful conduct of the program.
