Objectives:

- To discuss collectively about Gender roles, Gender based discrimination, stereotypes and sexual harassment in a discussion and activity-oriented method
- To analyze how sexual harassment can be detected and responded to.
- To mold out active bystanders in situations of sexual harassment.

Program Introduction:

Durga safety workshop was a 2.5 hour intensive session that discussed Gender based discrimination, stereotypes, Gender roles and importantly sexual harassment. The program was collaboratively conducted by Durga India, an NGO that focuses on individuals and communities to create a gender equitable space where women can feel safe and secure, and Acharya Institutes. The workshop envisages the generation of copious active bystanders who are equipped to respond timely and effectively to sexual harassment and thus making the victim feels safe.

Theme of the Event:

The event incorporated focused discussion on concept on equality, breaking stereotypes on gender roles, the way women and men have differently perceived by the society and the booming incidents of sexual harassment, proper as well as inaccurate method to respond to a sexual harassment.



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Detailed Report:

Durga safety workshop for the male Faculties of Acharya Institutes was organized in EE/EC block and commenced at sharp 2:30 pm. Mrs. Shashi Kiran Shetty, HOD of Department of Social Work introduced the facilitator. The facilitator of the session Ms. Tomcy initiated the workshop by an icebreaking session followed by providing a brief introduction of her and what the entire session would be all about. The foremost topic of discussion was re-establishing the actual definition of EQUALITY. Faculties were encouraged to give their personal definitions, leading to conjointly developing an acceptable definition.

Ms Tomcy read out a story to the faculties, insisting that they imagine the scenario. The story was composed of various characters including a driver, a security guard, cabin crew and a pilot, she then enquired the gender that each person allotted to these characters. Through this activity the topic of SOCIETAL PERCEPTION OF GENDER ROLES was understood and discussed. The STEREOTYPES that were tied on to gender and sexual harassment was yet another topic that was dealt with.

The session's major objective was to intensively discuss the topic of 'SEXUAL HARASSMENT', the rest of the workshop was solely focused to it. 2 volunteers from the faculties were asked to enact a sexual harassment scene in a bus and the rest of the audience had to act as bystanders. The bystanders were asked to give possible responses they would have while witnessing the scene. This role play explored accurate management of sexual harassment as to what action could be taken and what should not be done. The concept of active bystander was brought into the attention of the faculties. At 4:00 pm the session came to an end. Faculties were given an opportunity to convey their feedbacks or clear any queries. At 4:30 pm with certificate distribution and group photo the session was concluded.

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

Audience Feedback Summary:





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Outcomes:

1. Gained erudition on concept of gender equality, gender-based discrimination and sexual harassment.
2. Addressed proper management of sexual harassment; Proper method of handling a situation of sexual harassment and the method that should not be used or should be avoided.
3. Equipped to be active bystanders by timely responding and taking action against sexual harassment.

Conclusion and Audience Feedback Summary:

To recapitulate, the session addressed a socially relevant and pertinent issue that required more attention and discussion as almost 1 in 3 individuals around the globe are sexually abused. The session had provided valuable insights and an overall change in mindset to an extent to the audience.

Faculties could freely express their feedbacks and most opined that the session was the need of the hour. One suggestion that came up was sessions like these that discussed gender equality should be conducted incorporating both genders. Ms. Tomcy made the intention of segregating the session by gender clear by mentioning the sensitivity the topic of sexual harassment holds and separate session for men and women ensured more privacy and transparency to share personal instances or experience.

Theme of the Event: 'Seeing through her eyes'

Detailed Report: The AIGS Seminar Hall was well decorated by Ms Tomcy, Facilitator from Durga India and 3rd semester BSW students prior to the event. The concept of seeing through her eyes is



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that women perceive real life situations or public spaces differently than men. A week before the program, students were asked to send pictures that they felt portrayed a clear dichotomy in perception by the two genders. These pictures were displayed in AIGS Seminar Hall and students could walk around and talk about any picture they felt connected to. 3 batches from department of social work participated in seeing through her eyes including 3rd and 1st semester BSW as well as 1st semester MSW. Students walked around and chose pictures of their choice and expressed their thoughts on it. Ms, Tomcy facilitated the session and made sure that each student comprehensibly assimilated the essence of Seeing through her eyes. Ms.Tomcy incorporated role plays and focused discussions about the same. The session was interactive and informal in nature, it was ensured that a safe space was generated where any individual could freely convey and express their concerns or opinions. The session thrivingly evoked more progressive thoughts in the minds of the students. The event came to an end at 11:30 AM. At sharp 2:30 pm BSW students performed a flashmob in the area infront of Oya café with the sole aim of mobilizing crowd and inviting their attention to the 2nd open event of the day 'Occupying spaces'. Occupying spaces aimed to bring various social stigmas to the notice of the youths who are powerful change agents. 3 posters were made with a statements on each i.e. 'if you were told to behave in a certain manner because of your gender', 'if you felt unsafe in public spaces' and 'if you were discriminated because of your gender'. Each statement invited likeminded people who have went through similar situations to come together as a circle and share their experiences or discuss on how a change can beinitiated to break the shackles of stigma. Thus, 3 circles were formulated each with a facilitator who encouraged fellow members of the circle to share their viewpoints. An average of 50 students and faculties from Department of Social work participated in the open event. Occupying spaces was undoutedly a gallant initiative that intensively discussed the prevailing gender based discriminations. The progam was concluded by 4 pm post which group picture was taken and eventually the gathering dispersed.

Both events were successfully organised and met its sole objective of widely discussing gender based discrimination.


